Peel Regional Police Constable David Lewis	Garage - appropriate lighting at exits; clean; bright; automatic door closes quickly Landscaping – well attended; additional lighting has been added; appropriate cameras and signage Circular Driveway – suggested adding bollards to avoid vehicles mounting curb Signage – appropriate wayfinding signs around and in the building Dumpsters – clean; clear sightlines Doors – locked upon exit; clean (suggested stickers be added to doors reminding tenants to not let anyone in behind them) Bethesda Common – Clear sightlines; no safety concerns
Peel Regional Police Constable Vito Padano	Proposed Development – Sightlines are appropriate for new buildings (Suggestions to add appropriate cameras and DVR system to record for 2 week periods) Dog Walk – great idea to create informal surveillance (more eyes on the property at various times) Landscaping – suggested vegetation be lower than 6’ to create open sightlines Parking Lot – suggested speed hump Security – suggested on-site security; gate access control for vehicles; card access control for common areas (garage, common areas; Neighbourhood Watch Program
Peel Regional Police Inspector Herbert Hiltz	Review crime statistics for existing buildings, Bethesda Common and surrounding community; calls from January, 2017 to May, 2018 were reviewed; statistically a safe area compared to other areas in Ward 3 and all of Mississauga; encouraged residents to visit Peel Police Crime Mapping Site to see recent activity in community
